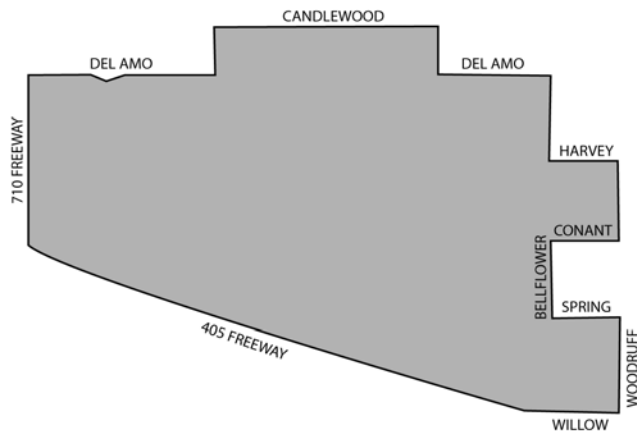
\*Teens (15 & Up) and Adults interested in working in the snack bar can fill out an application during registration.
